### Barbara L. Anthony Fellowship 2016

The Indian Law Resource Center is a non-profit legal advocacy organization that provides legal advice, assistance, and representation to Indian tribes and indigenous communities throughout the Americas. We are seeking an individual with a serious interest in non-profit, public interest work. This individual will assist with and learn about the work of the Center including fund raising, communications, and other work to protect and promote the rights of Indian and Alaska Native nations.

To this end, we are offering a fellowship in our Helena, Montana office with a starting date in June, 2016. The fellowship opportunity requires a minimum eight week commitment and includes research, writing, or other work on Indian rights issues related to current projects of the Indian Law Resource Center. The Fellowship offers a stipend of \$2,500 for the term of the Fellowship. Applicants are welcome to supplement this stipend with additional financial support through their school's public interest program. Legal training is not required.

Founded in 1978, the Indian Law Resource Center is a non-profit law and advocacy organization established and directed by American Indians. We provide legal assistance to tribes and other indigenous peoples in the United States and in Central and South America who are working to protect their land, resources, human rights, environment, and cultural heritage. The Center seeks to overcome threats to indigenous peoples by establishing national and international legal standards that uphold indigenous human rights and dignity, strengthen indigenous self-determination, and protect indigenous lands and resources.
